India at UNFF-20: Leading Forest Conservation Efforts

The 20th session of the United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF-20), held from May 5 to 9, 2025, at the UN Headquarters in New York, marked a critical moment for evaluating global efforts toward sustainable forest management. - Promote integration of Country-Led Initiatives (CLIs) to influence global forest governance.
- Encourage valuation of forest ecosystems and restoration of degraded forest landscapes.

India's Contributions at UNFF-20:

Forest Cover and Restoration:

India highlighted that it now has 25.17% of its geographical area under forest and tree cover, showcasing achievements in afforestation and restoration through policy innovation and convergence of resources.

• Ecosystem Service Valuation:

India emphasized integrating ecosystem service valuation into national forest policy planning. Studies from Uttarakhand, Rajasthan, and tiger reserves were shared, quantifying services like carbon sequestration, water provisioning, and biodiversity conservation.

• Technology and Community Engagement:

India's experience in using technology for monitoring and engaging local communities in forest conservation was a key part of its presentation.
